The Battery Conservancy is a nonprofit organization dedicated to revitalizing The Battery, the 25-acre public park located at the southern tip of Manhattan. The Battery is at the forefront of sustainable urban park planning and organic horticulture. Battery Urban Farm, started in 2011 and is the first farm in downtown Manhattan since the Dutch planted theirs in 1625. The educational programs engage elementary, middle, and high school students, as well as local community groups and individuals, in a hands-on experience of organic farming. BUF produce is donated to schools that participate in farm programming and non-profit partner Drive Change. Battery Urban Farm includes a vegetable farm, forest farm, 4 oyster gardens, and an extensive composting program.

The Educator position is part-time for the spring season with the possibility of extension into the summer and/or fall seasons. Applicants should have experience working on small farms and in youth education, and should be comfortable working outdoors and with students of various ages and diverse backgrounds. Educators will assist in teaching educational programs on the farm and throughout The Battery and in general maintenance on the farm.
